





IN REMEMBRANCE

REV. DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. January 15, 1929 – April 4, 1968

Today, we celebrate the life of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Born in Atlanta, GA, Rev. Dr. King was an African American clergyman and Nobel Peace Prize winner, one of the principal leaders of the American Civil Rights Movement and a prominent advocate of nonviolent protest. King's challenges to segregation and racial discrimination in the 1950s and 1960s helped convince many white Americans to support the cause of civil rights in the United States. In 1957, Rev. Dr. King helped found the Southern Christian Leadership Conference and helped organize the 1963 March on Washington where he delivered the keynote address to an audience of more than 200,000 Civil Rights' supporters. His "I Have a Dream" speech expressed the hopes of the Civil Rights Movement in oratory as moving as any in American history. After his assassination in 1968, Rev. Dr. King became a symbol of protest in the struggle for racial justice.
