PRAY FOR THE UNBORN: The Rosary is said every 2nd Sunday before Mass. Please join us in the Sanctuary. **SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Preparation and celebration of sacrament scheduled as needed. **Call the parish office. RECONCILIATION** is celebrated before Mass, and by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: The Archdiocese requires a four-month preparation period before marriage. A couple *must* inform the Parish Office before a date is set.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST: In order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist in second grade, children must regularly participate in Catholic religious' education in Kindergarten and First Grade.

CONFIRMATION: In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious' education from First Eucharist until they are a junior in High School. Classes are held the last Tuesday of each month.
RCIA: Adult religious education classes – every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost.
SUNDAY SCHOOL/CCD: Children/youth religious education classes every Sunday after Mass, September through May.

PLEASE WEAR MASKS




To help protect our employees and others, all persons visiting the Mission, school and parish offices must wear a





FAITH IN ACTION ALABAMA



The next Faith in Action Alabama Montgomery Hub session will take place this Thursday, July 16, 6:00 p.m. -

The primary focus of the Hub session will be on Freedom Vote 2020, Faith in Action Alabama's voter engagement campaign leading up to this year's November elections. Our goal is to reach out to 160,000 infrequent African American, Latino, and low-wealth white Alabamian voters. Through the work of phonebank teams, social media, and congregational announcements we will reach our goal. We will launch the campaign in the first week of August. (On July 21, 6:00 p.m. -7:30 p.m. there will be a phonebank training session via Zoom.)

This pro-democracy campaign is about bringing more Alabamians into the voting process, so we can elect officials who represent grassroots communities and are not beholden to wealthy interests. This campaign is meant to counter the Pharaohs of Alabama who want to choose who votes, as opposed to voters choosing who represents them.






If you will be 18 years of age or older on election day and are not yet registered to vote go to www.sos.alabama.gov/alabama-
