

RESURRECTION CATHOLIC SCHOOL



Resurrection Catholic School reopened on Tuesday, September 8, 2020 with a total enrollment of 76 students in grades PK-7th. Considering learning the "new norm", all went well. We developed a "Safer School Reopening Plan" for the safety and wellbeing of our students, faculty and staff to include: Touchless hand sanitizing stations in each classroom, social distancing floor decals, and touchless soap and towel dispensers in the bathrooms. In addition, the water fountains are disabled and children bring bottled water each day. Grades K-7th grades enter through two entry points in the back

of the school and Pre-K students enter through the front doors. All teachers and students must wear masks daily and upon daily building entry, temperature checks are given. To further promote social distancing, student desks are placed six feet apart with maximum class sizes no larger than 12. We also set up a quarantine room in the event that a child becomes ill and needs to be isolated until picked up by a parent. Further, all students will use a single electronic device to ensure no sharing.

We received funding allocation from the CARES ACT, and we have provided a wishlist of PPE. Once products are received, we will also have plexiglass student desk shields, teacher desk shields and a safety shield for the front office receptionist desk installed.

PRAY FOR THE UNBORN: The Rosarv is said every 2nd Sunday before Mass. Please join us in the Sanctuary. SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Preparation and celebration of sacrament scheduled as needed. Call the parish office.

RECONCILIATION is celebrated before Mass, and by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: The Archdiocese requires a four-month preparation period before marriage. A couple *must* inform the Parish Office before a date is set.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST: In order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist in second grade, children must regularly participate in Catholic religious' education in Kindergarten and First Grade.

CONFIRMATION: In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious' education from First Eucharist until they are a junior in High School, Classes are held the last Tuesday of each month.

RCIA: Adult religious education classes – every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost.

SUNDAY SCHOOL/CCD: Children/youth religious education classes every Sunday after Mass, September through May.

to receive communion. We will enter through the front doors of the Church, proceed up the main aisle...observing social distancing....and depart through the side doors near the sanctuary.


Those who desire may remain in the Church and socially distant pray in the pews for a period of time. Masks must be worn right up until the time of receiving the sacred species.

Purpose: Pro Life people make a public, prayerful protest against abortion. Abortion is the deliberate taking of life; has always been, is and will always be wrong. Pro Life Christians move from the pew to the sidewalks to stand publicly against this act.

History: The first Life Chain was held in 1987 in California. Life chains are now formed in over 1000 cities throughout the U.S. Always held on the 1st Sunday in October, mid afternoon, so as not to interfere with Sunday Services, yet, be a part of Sunday Worship. This will be Montgomery's 22nd Life Chain. Abortion became a "right" following the infamous Roe Vs. Wade decision on January 22, 1973. This is an interdenominational event and people from many churches help form the "Chain."
