LENTEN ACTIVITIES



This Wednesday, February 17, 2021, we will enter into the Season of Lent. Ashes will be distributed in the church between 12:30 p.m. until 4:30 p.m. and at a brief service at 6:00 p.m.

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years old or older on Ash Wednesday, Lenten Fridays and Good Friday. *Fasting* is to be observed by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59 years of age on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound may take only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted, but there should be no eating of solid foods between meals.

Every Friday during Lent, the Way of the Cross will be prayed at 6:00 p.m. in the Church.

There will be no soup supper during Lenten Fridays this year due to Covid-19.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Preparation and celebration of sacrament scheduled as needed. **Call the parish office. RECONCILIATION** is celebrated before Mass, and by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: The Archdiocese requires a four-month preparation period before marriage. A couple *must* inform the Parish Office before a date is set.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST: In order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist in Second Grade, children must regularly participate in Catholic religious education in Kindergarten and First Grade.

CONFIRMATION: In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious education from First Eucharist until they are a Junior in High School. Classes are held the last Sunday of each month. RCIA: Adult religious education classes – every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost. 
