THE FEAST OF ST. KATHARINE DREXEL



On Wednesday, March 3 we celebrate the feast day of St. Katharine Drexel, foundress of the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, a congregation dedicated to the interracial apostolate in the USA and Haiti. She was born in 1858, into a wealthy and prominent Philadelphia family and died in 1955. She dedicated her life and a considerable fortune to improving the material and spiritual well-being of Black and Native American people. She founded many schools, including Xavier University in New Orleans (1915) and St. John the Baptist School, here in Montgomery, which merged with Resurrection Catholic School in 1994. When she died, more than 500 Sisters were teaching in 63 schools throughout the country.

Katharine was beatified by Pope John Paul II on November 20, 1988. Because of her lifelong dedication to her faith and her selfless service to the oppressed, Pope John Paul II canonized her on October 1, 2000 to become only the second recognized American-born saint. Today Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament serve in elementary and secondary schools as well as at Xavier University of Louisiana in New Orleans. They are also involved in a variety of other services including pastoral and spiritual ministries, social services, counseling, religious education, and health care, primarily but not exclusively among Black and Native American peoples. In 1991, St. John the Baptist School, founded by St. Katherine Drexel and her Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament, was merged into Resurrection's existing school After the consolidation, the Brothers of the Sacred Heart led the school for several years. *To learn more about this virtuous woman and the order she founded, visit www.katharinedrexel.org/*

PRAY FOR THE UNBORN: The Rosary is said every 2nd Sunday before Mass. Please join us in the Sanctuary.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Preparation and celebration of sacrament scheduled as needed. Call the parish office.

RECONCILIATION is celebrated before Mass, and by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: The Archdiocese requires a four-month preparation period before marriage. A couple *must* inform the Parish Office before a date is set.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST: In order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist in Second Grade, children must regularly participate in Catholic religious education in Kindergarten and First Grade.

CONFIRMATION: In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious education from First Eucharist until they are a Junior in High School. Classes are held the last Sunday of each month.

RCIA: Adult religious education classes - every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost.

SUNDAY SCHOOL/CCD: Children/youth religious education classes every Sunday after Mass, September through May.
