RECONCILIATION is celebrated before Mass, and by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: The Archdiocese requires a four-month preparation period before marriage. A couple *must* inform the Parish Office before a date is set.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST: In order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist in Second Grade, children must regularly participate in Catholic religious education in Kindergarten and First Grade.

CONFIRMATION: In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious education from First Eucharist until they are a Junior in High School. Classes are held the last Sunday of each month.

RCIA: Adult religious education classes – every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost.

SUNDAY SCHOOL/CCD: Children/youth religious education classes every Sunday after Mass, September through May.

PARISH NEWS

LENTEN ACTIVITIES

Every Friday during Lent, the Way of the Cross will be prayed at 6:00 p.m. in the Church.

There will be no soup supper during Lenten Fridays this year due to Covid-19.

The following protocols will be observed during the Triduum and Easter liturgies:

- 1. No one is to attend Mass if they feel sick.
- 2. Social spacing in churches is required. Only every other pew may be used.
- 3. Seating will be assigned for the Easter Sunday service.
- 4. The use of pews must respect social distancing. Care must be exercised that only the proper number of people attend Mass so that social distancing may be maintained. This means that no one is to sit within 6 feet of one another unless living in the same household.
- 5. Each person will receive their own personal missalette that they can take home and keep for use throughout the year. Missalettes will not be collected at the end of Mass.
- 6. Liturgical ministers must also observe social distancing.
- 7. Offertory baskets will not be passed person to person. A collection basket will be placed by the entrance for your offertory.
- 8. The Sign of Peace will be retained but no physical contact is allowed (no hugs, handshakes, etc.)
- 9. Communicants are to keep social distancing when in the Communion line.
- 10. Communion will not be distributed from the chalice.
- 11. Although people may wear masks and gloves to Mass, Communion may not be distributed or received with gloves.
- 12. People must maintain social distancing when departing the church
