

PRAY FOR THE UNBORN: The Rosarv is said every 2nd Sunday before Mass. Please join us in the Sanctuary.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM: Preparation and celebration of sacrament scheduled as needed. Call the parish office.

RECONCILIATION is celebrated before Mass, and by appointment.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE: The Archdiocese requires a four-month preparation period before marriage. A couple *must* inform the Parish Office before a date is set.

SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST: In order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist in Second Grade, children must regularly participate in Catholic religious education in Kindergarten and First Grade.

CONFIRMATION: In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious education from First Eucharist until they are a Junior in High School, Classes are held the last Sunday of each month,

RCIA: Adult religious education classes – every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost.

SUNDAY SCHOOL/CCD: Children/youth religious education classes every Sunday after Mass, September through May.

RESURRECTION HEALTH MINISTRY



March is National Kidney Month. The kidneys process nearly 200 quarts of blood every day and sift out about 2

quarts of waste products and extra water, which become urine. More than 661,000 Americans suffer from CKD. Of these, 468,000 need an artificial kidney machine (dialysis), and approximately 193,000 live with a functioning kidney transplant.

Leading Causes of Kidney Disease

- Diabetes (sometimes called "sugar").
- Hypertension (high blood pressure).
- Other genetic factors, such as polycystic kidney disease.

Risk Factors: Those at a higher risk of developing kidney disease are African-American males, the elderly and those with family history of kidney disease.

Are you at risk?

- 1. Do you have a family history of kidney disease?
- 2. Do you have diabetes?
- 3. Do you have high blood pressure?
- 4. Are you an African-American, particularly male, between the ages of 30-35?
- 5. Do you have a personal history of obesity, cardiovascular disease, HIV, Hepatitis C, or malignancy?
