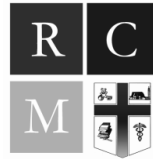

**PRAY FOR THE UNBORN:** The Rosary is said every 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday before Mass. Please join us in the Sanctuary.

**SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM:** Call the parish office to schedule a baptism class as well as a date for the baptism.

**RECONCILIATION** is celebrated before Mass, and by appointment.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:** The Archdiocese requires a four-month preparation period before marriage. A couple **must** inform the Parish Office before a date is set.

**SACRAMENT OF FIRST EUCHARIST:** In order to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist in Second Grade, children must regularly participate in Catholic religious education in Kindergarten and First Grade.

**CONFIRMATION:** In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, young people must have regularly participated in Catholic religious education from First Eucharist until they are a Junior in High School. Classes are held the last Sunday of each month.

**RCIA:** Adult religious education classes – every Wednesday at 7 p.m. from September through Pentecost.

**SUNDAY SCHOOL/CCD:** Children/youth religious education classes every Sunday after Mass, September through May.

## RESURRECTION HEALTH MINISTRY

### TIPS FOR PREVENTING HEAT-RELATED ILLNESS

**Wear Appropriate Clothing:** Choose lightweight, light-colored, loose-fitting clothing.

**Stay Cool Indoors:** Stay in an air-conditioned place as much as possible.

**Schedule Outdoor Activities Carefully:** Try to limit your outdoor activity to when it's coolest, like morning and evening hours. Rest often in shady areas so that your body has a chance to recover.

**Pace Yourself:** Cut down on exercise during the heat. If you're not accustomed to working or exercising in a hot environment, start slowly and pick up the pace gradually.

**Wear Sunscreen:** Sunburn affects your body's ability to cool down and can make you dehydrated.

**Do Not Leave Children in Cars:** Cars can quickly heat up to dangerous temperatures, even with a window cracked open.

**Avoid Hot and Heavy Meals:** They add heat to your body!

**Drink Plenty of Fluids:** Drink more fluids, regardless of how active you are. Don't wait until you're thirsty to drink.

**Replace Salt and Minerals:** Heavy sweating removes salt and minerals from the body that need to be replaced. A sports drink can replace the salt and minerals you lose in sweat.

**Keep Your Pets Hydrated:** Provide plenty of fresh water for your pets, and leave the water in a shady area.

**Check for Updates:** Check your local news for extreme heat alerts and safety tips and to learn about any cooling shelters in your area.

**Know the Signs:** Learn the signs and symptoms of heat-related illnesses and how to treat them.

**Use a Buddy System:** When working in the heat, monitor the condition of your co-workers and have someone do the same for you.

**Monitor Those at High Risk:** Although anyone at any time can suffer from heat-related illness, some people are at greater risk than others – the elderly and infants.

**Visit adults at risk at least twice a day** and closely watch them for signs of heat exhaustion or heat stroke. Infants and young children, of course, need much more frequent watching.
